Invitation to the first Nordic amputation course

ISPO Nordic hereby invites you to lower limb amputation course. It is open for surgeons performing amputations, prosthetists, physiotherapists and other professionals of the amputation team. Maximal number of participants is 75. To make sure the course is being truly Nordic, places will be reserved for each country with 20 places for Sweden, 10 places each for Norway, Denmark, Finland, and 5 places for Iceland. These will be held until December 22. After that there will be no restrictions on applications.

The course is conducted in multiprofessional seminar groups, all following the same curriculum and contents. We will demonstrate and discuss the surgical amputation techniques at all levels of the lower limb. The course will then cover the postoperative phase, the rehabilitation process, and finally modern prosthetic techniques and socket designs.

In addition, lectures will address the new consensus recommendations from the European Society for Vascular Surgery (EVES) with guidelines related to amputations, as well as the latest developments in phantom limb pain management. Other topics include Osseointegration and SwedeAmp.

The faculty consists of two professors from European countries, numerous Swedish in their respective fields, and a strong foundation in clinical research.

Where: Quality Hotel View, Malmö Sweden. Close to the railway station, 20 minutes from the airport of Copenhagen

Language: The course will be held in English

Fee: 5500 SEK, includes teaching, coffee and lunch both days and a course dinner on the evening of Januari 25. Members of ISPO pay a reduced fee of 4000 SEK
